Guild Member Achieves National Recognition:

Congratulations to Don Ransom, whose Queen Anne drop-leaf table is showcased on p. 88 of the May/June 2005 issue of Fine Woodworking (No. 177). Don based his design for the 42" diameter round walnut table on pieces in the Winterthur Museum.

September 21, 2005 Meeting Highlights:

The theme of the meeting was inlay techniques, featuring an extensive demonstration and discussion by Gary Hayes. Readers who attended the November 2004 meeting will recall Gary's spectacular federal style drop-leaf table in figured cherry, with sand-shaded fans and other inlays in holly and ebony. Gary showed us exactly how it's done. He showed us, explained and demonstrated his hand-made veneering tools. He demonstrated each step in inlaying straight white lines -- cutting the groove, preparing the strip of holly, working it into the groove, trimming it with precision and leveling it to perfection. Then he topped an already impressive presentation by showing us, step by step, how to lay out, cut, prepare and inlay federal style sand-shaded oval fans. And for those who aspire to try this, he provided copies of veneering articles from Fine Woodworking that he had found useful. Our thanks to Gary for a first-rate presentation.

Also, John Dunbar demonstrated the new Veritas Honing Guide, which he finds to be a notable improvement on its predecessor, and answered members' questions about that guide and about related techniques for sharpening and honing plane blades and chisels.

Ralph Brisbin presented a candle lantern he built mainly of wood, with some brass components. The piece is visually striking, with contrasting horizontal components of Douglas fir and vertical components of purpleheart. Ralph made the brass hardware himself, and finished the wooden elements with shellac. Judy Hodgson presented a handsome and distinctive wood-covered photo album with

brass hinges. The covers are a complex glue-up of bookmatched walnut, cherry, mahogany, oak and maple.

Jim Kirkbride won the raffle prize -- the Veritas Medium Shoulder Plane chosen as Best in Class by Fine Woodworking magazine.

Annual Picnic:

The Picnic was held Saturday, October 8 at the at the DuPont company's Chestnut Run Pavilion; our thanks to John Baker who arranged for that locale. Despite a teeming downpour 34 people turned out (including nine children) and a fine time was had by all. At one table Harry Coulsting amazed those nearby with a demonstration of conjuring, at which he is adept.

2005–06 Meeting Schedule, with changed date and place for the April 2006 meeting:
