March Meeting Highlights

Many thanks go to Jeanne Batulis for taking notes and pictures at the March meeting.

Tony Albano demonstrated his sharpening technique, based on the Scary Sharp products. First he cleans up and squares the blades on a grinder with a 25 degree bevel, then using the Veritas angle grinder tool he puts a 30 degree bevel on the blade. Next he takes it to his setup sharpening tray which includes two sheets of micro abrasives (15 and 5 microns) adhered to glass for sharpening and a ceramic stone for honing.



A couple of swipes on each grit and then the back of the blade against the stone and he's done!

As long as the blades are square, all that's needed for routine maintenance is the abrasive paper and stone, which Tony has mounted in a wooden box so the whole set is self-contained.

Ron Hasse brought a segmented bowl that he turned and offered for Tim Sabo's comments (Tim approved).



Paul Welsh brought in a couple of "quick-grip" type clamps purchased from Harbor Freight with the warning that, although inexpensive, they break easily. He suggested buying more than you need to accommodate the ones that break. The consensus of the group was that all Harbor Freight clamps seem to have

problems; however they are so inexpensive they are still a good buy even when buying extras.



Wayne Shoals brought a stained glass panel enclosed in a wooden frame, completed in the Tiffany style which involves copper foil, solder, and liquid patina. It was suggested that this would make an interesting presentation in the future.



Hans Francke brought two hinged-top boxes: a walnut one with mitered joints set up as a tea box with removable dividers, and a cherry one with dovetailed joints and a decorative groove in the lid.



Brazilian Cherry Finishes:



Seven people brought the Brazilian cherry pieces back with the following finishes applied:

Richard Libera:

- (1) Minwax Natural stain and 3 coats of Waterlox (brushed)
- (2) Four coats of home-made finishing oil (1/3 oil, 1/3 thinner, 1/3 varnish) (rubbed)

Jeanne Batulis:

- (1) 3 coats Guardsman Nitrocellulose lacquer (aerosol)
- (2) 3 coats Guardsman Waterborne lacquer (HVLP)

Jim Kirkbride :

- 4 coats Zinsser shellac (brushed)
- (1) 3 coats Watco Teak Oil (wet sanded// rubbed)

Charlie Given:

3 coats Minwax Waterborne Polyurethane, followed by wax

Tony Albano:

Minwax Wipe-On Poly, which generated much debate over whether it is best to brush or wipe this product

Jerry Sheeran:

- (1) Blonde shellac sealer followed by Waterlox
- (2) General Oil followed by Polyurethane
- (3) Wipe-On Polyurethane
- (4) Home-made finishing oil
- (5) Antique Cherry stain, Wipe-On Polyurethane
- (6) Early American Cherry stain, Wipe-On Polyurethane

John Dunbar:

- (1) Linseed Oil followed by 2 coats of Shellac
- (2) Ammonia fumed followed by 2 coats of shellac (used blueprint ammonia left for one day)

Federal Style Baltimore Card Tables

Gary Hays, Hans Francke, and John Dunbar have been working on the inlays and banding for the tables. Gary demonstrated his method of completing the inlays per an article entitled "Six Steps to a Perfect Inlay" by Roland Johnson, copies of which Gary handed out to the group, and John showed the differences in his methods for making the same pieces. John demonstrated his method of constructing the walnut and maple bandings, which he makes on a tablesaw.
